About Netivot Shalom

Netivot Shalom invites you to engage in a cross-generational discovery of Jewish inspiration and purpose. Our community is defined by the values of:

- **Belonging** we nurture connectedness with each other, with the broader community, and with Israel.
- Learning we provide introductory and continuing encounters with Jewish wisdom.
- **Ritual** we strive to deepen personal engagement with the sacred.
- Justice we embrace Judaism's call to repair the world through deeds of loving kindness and social action.

Netivot Shalom comprises more than 380 households of couples and single adults with and without children, seniors, young adults, and students. We are Jews from Ashkenazi, Sephardic, Mizrahi, and non-Jewish backgrounds; from Reconstructionist to Orthodox religious traditions and no religious tradition at all; Jews in traditional families and Jews in LGBTQ+ families--all exploring our Jewish identity in a non-judgmental, nurturing environment. And we warmly welcome non-Jewish partners in interfaith households.

We celebrate our community's range of personal philosophies, practices, and needs. Netivot Shalom offers many ways to meet these diverse expectations: weekly Shabbat morning services, holiday services, Wednesday morning services, and many other educational, spiritual and community activities. Throughout the year, there is weekly programming during the day and evening, covering a range of interests including, but not limited to, Israel learning, knitting, youth community, concerts, adult Jewish education, and much more.

A Brief History of the Congregation

In 1989, a small group of families began holding their own Shabbat services together in their homes, calling themselves members of the "Berkeley Conservative Congregation." Their founding principle was to combine traditional Jewish practices with the Berkeley ethos of participation and egalitarianism. That *havura* grew over the years into a spiritual home for traditional, egalitarian Jews in the East Bay.

In 1992, we renamed ourselves Congregation Netivot Shalom (Paths of Peace). In June 2005, we moved into our home at 1316 University Avenue in Berkeley. The building was made possible, in large part, due to volunteer labor as well as the contributions of our members.

Netivot Shalom has benefited since its inception from the wisdom, guidance, and leadership of Rabbi Emeritus Stuart Kelman. Rabbi Kelman retired in 2007, but we benefit from his continued participation in our community.

Upon Rabbi Kelman's retirement, Menachem Creditor became Netivot Shalom's rabbi for the next 11 years and continued the development of Netivot Shalom as a spiritual home for progressive, Conservative Judaism in the East Bay.

In 2018, we welcomed Rabbi Chai Levy as our new spiritual leader. Rabbi Levy brings tremendous strengths to this position, including her participatory ethos, 16 years' pulpit experience with exposure to all aspects of congregational life, and her gift of music. Rabbi Chai Levy is known for compassionate pastoral counseling, an ability to relate to people of all ages, and a commitment to spiritual leadership within our participatory synagogue model.

Our Traditions

Members of our congregation lead our religious services along with the rabbi; lay members usually present the weekly *d'rash* (comments on the weekly Torah portion). All levels of familiarity with the texts and prayers are represented among our members, and, for those who wish to learn more, we have many opportunities to learn. While not all of our members come from kosher homes, we have a kosher kitchen in our synagogue and all meals at the synagogue are kosher.

We celebrate and memorialize life-cycle events reflecting our Jewish values: new babies, brits, *Simchat bats* (daughter's naming), weddings, B'nei mitzvah, and the passing of loved ones. Volunteer committees devote time to helping families make their way through life-cycle events, whether expected or otherwise.

Youth and Family

The preschool at Netivot Shalom offers children from ages two through five years a curriculum rich in Jewish content and Hebrew language.

We have developed nationally recognized children's programs and continue to innovate and develop programs that meet the changing needs of our families. These include Shabbat B'Yachad (ages 0 to 5 years and their parents), Ketzev Youth Chavurah (K – 5), and Amitim for 6th and 7th graders preparing for their Bar or Bat Mitzvah.
